1. To all of the Brothers in attendance at the 138<sup>th</sup> National Encampment in Independence, Ohio, I thank you for your continued support and faith in me. I want to thank the Brothers and Sisters of the Department of Ohio, their Department's Host Committee, and our National Host Committee for an outstanding encampment. Please start planning your trip to Atlanta, Georgia on August 13-16, 2020 for the 139<sup>th</sup> National Encampment. Let's make this one even grander.
2. My congratulations go out to the newly elected National Presidents: Jessica Booth, Woman's Relief Corps; Judy Baron, Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic; Sandra Millin, Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War, 1861-1865; and Wanda Langdon, Auxiliary to the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War. I look forward to our organizations working together during the coming year in honoring our Boys in Blue.

The following National Special Committees will remain in place to serve the Order: National Special Committee on Encampment Credentials, National Special Committee on Memorial University Redesign, National Special Committee on Real Sons & Daughters, National Special Committee on Website Redesign, and National Special Committee on Hereditary Issues (2021).

13. Per the 138<sup>th</sup> National Encampment, we have established a special five-year committee, with a term ending August 2024, to Negotiate Encampment Contracts with the Allied Orders. This committee will be chaired by Brother Mark Day, PCinC.

14. Per the 138<sup>th</sup> National Encampment, we have established a special two-year committee, with a term ending August 2021, to cooperate in honoring all those who have served our country patriotically in any war. This is one of our purposes as defined in our Federal Charter, Section 200302. This committee will be chaired by Brother Dexter Bishop, PDC.

15. Per the 138<sup>th</sup> National Encampment, we have established a special one-year committee, with a term ending August 2020, to create a Monument Protection policy. This committee will be chaired by Brother Donald Shaw, PCinC.

16. I have started a new CinC appointed committee to allow our forms to be filled out and submitted by electronic means. Form 3: Membership Application, Form 30: Camp Status Report, Form 49: Certification of Election and Installation of Department Officers, and a single form/payment for National Encampments are the immediate targets. I envision this to be a two year effort. This committee will be chaired by Brother Brian Pierson, SVCinC.

17. Recruiting is always important. We survive by bringing in new blood. All new Brothers have some skill that will be beneficial to the Order. The new Brother might be an outstanding Treasurer, Patriotic Instructor, or Graves Registration officer, and the possibilities are endless. Recruiting doesn't have to be difficult. Most of us have a brother, son, grandson, uncle or cousin who isn't a member. Our activities to remember our ancestors are an excellent family bonding experience. Many of us belong to other organizations that have members who could be potential Brothers. And, don't forget about potential Associate members as they can serve the Order in most positions and all activities.

18. Throughout my years with the Order, I realized our Brothers offer an incredible support structure. Whenever something tough came up I found a Brother willing to assist. No one should be afraid to reach for any position as there will be Brothers there to assist you in the betterment of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War. What will you run for next?
